Governor Appoints D. Scott Bowling to Lawrence County Court of Common Pleas

Columbus, Ohio – Ohio Governor Ted Strickland announced today the appointment of D. Scott Bowling to a seat on the Lawrence County Court of Common Pleas, General and Domestic Relations Division.

The seat was vacated after the passing of Judge Frank McCown.

“Scott has exhibited professionalism and integrity in his law career and community life,” Strickland said. “His commitment to Lawrence County is clear, and I am certain he will work tirelessly as a common pleas judge.”

Bowling, 41, of Kitts Hill, is a partner with Lambert, McWhorter and Bowling, LLC, in Ironton. He has been serving clients for more than 10 years primarily in the areas of personal injury, medical negligence and Social Security disability.

Previously, Bowling worked as a medical technologist at River Valley Health Systems from 1986-1996.

Bowling is active in the Oakland Chapel United Brethren Church, where he serves as a Sunday school teacher and Missions Board member. He is a volunteer for the Symmes Valley High School and Junior High basketball teams as well as a little league baseball coach.

Bowling received a bachelor’s degree in business administration from Ohio University in 1988 and a law degree from Capital University in 1997. He is a member of the Ohio State Bar Association, West Virginia Bar Association and Kentucky Bar Association.

“I look forward for the opportunity to serve the people of Lawrence County in this important role,” Bowling said.

Bowling’s term as judge will begin on September 24. His term will extend until February 9, 2009.
